



Examples of initiatives that promote sustainable seafood production.



Regional Fisheries Management Organisations (RFMOs) encourage fair and sustainable management of shared marine resources.6



The Global Sustainable Seafood Initiative (GSSI) provides a benchmarking tool to recognise seafood certification schemes as sustainable.7



Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreements (SFPAs) are set up by the EU with countries outside its borders. EU vessels have access to surplus resources that the partner country does not fish.



European Maritime and Fisheries Fund (EMFF) aims to improve the sustainability and profitability of EU fisheries and aguaculture.

Solutions

Ensuring a sustainable supply of seafood is a global challenge.



Science

Define sustainable fisheries management policies using the best available scientific data.



Control

Ensure that these policies are properly enforced, by monitoring fishing activities.



Awareness

Improve education on the benefits of sustainable aquaculture and fisheries.



Security

Ensure the prevention of illegal, unreported and unregulated fisheries across the world, from sea to plate.

Under EU law, only certified products can enter the EU market. Non-compliant vessels can be banned.
